## Message from the Chair

One of the issues currently engaging the Executive Committee is the effect of the pandemic on ecumenical activity in our area. In a sense we are now living in a post-pandemic society with the emphasis on returning to life as normal, and living with the virus, even as Covid infections are rising again in the UK. Our churches began to re-open a year ago and our ecumenical work resumed. I don't know how the pandemic has affected the attendance at our individual member churches, but I sense that the churches are naturally focusing on nurturing and rebuilding their own congregations. No-one doubts the value of what we do as Churches Together but it is less of a priority.

This may explain the lower attendance at some of our events – for example the Ascension Day service in May, and our internal Council meetings. But it's not so simple. The Jubilee Songs of Praise held at St Peter & St Paul Godalming in early June was very well-attended, and the Good Friday Service of Witness in April brought together many church members as well as attracting the public. So there are clearly other factors in play. Still, we need to keep working to demonstrate the relevance and importance of ecumenical activity in conditions as we currently find them.

Please remember in your prayers the PCCs of St Peter and St Paul Godalming and St Mark's Ockford Ridge, and St John's Busbridge and St Peter's Hambledon, as they meet on 11 July to take an important decision about their future. If the proposals are agreed, they will become a single united parish while continuing to exist as individual churches, effectively creating a Minster. This will affect how they operate internally and also how they engage with our other member churches. At our next Council meeting on 26 October, we will be discussing the implications of the new Minster church (if agreed) for ecumenical activity in our area.

Also at the Council meeting we will have some input from an external speaker. Grace Keal, the Ecumenical Coordinator for Churches Together in Surrey, will be talking about her role, and giving us a wider perspective on the successes and challenges faced by Churches Together groups in other areas. This should be interesting.

St Peter & St Paul would become a Minster Church, and Godalming previously had a significant Minster ministry of love, care, proclamation, teaching, worship, and presence. We continue to seek God's guidance and wisdom as we move towards the decision for this Vision to progress, which will be made in July.
