Message from the Chair

Although some people favour the 'Garden Tomb' in Jerusalem, I've always taken the view that the Holy Sepulchre, the traditional site of Jesus's tomb, was the one most likely to be genuine. In the 1990s, archaeologist Martin Biddle led a team which concluded that there was an undisturbed, ancient rock-cut structure between the inner and outer marble 'skins' of the Edicule, the little chapel that marks the site of the tomb, inside the Church of the Holy Sepulchre. Just this month further excavations suggested that in the time of Christ the whole area was indeed a garden as the Gospel describes, with remains of vines and olive trees.

The Empty Tomb is a very strange symbol or idea to base a religion around, when the whole point of it is its emptiness, the fact that there is nothing in it. It's a place where something of profound importance happened, but which left no trace, and which the Scriptures never describe: all they tell us is the reaction of people after the event. As Rowan Williams wrote, 'however early we come to the Tomb, we find Jesus has already risen'. Over the night of Easter, the Patriarch of Jerusalem will pass the New Fire out of the Edicule to the worshippers in the church, and very curiously they will be celebrating something which isn't there, as those of us who have similar ceremonies in our own churches will: the lack of a body, the absence of an end that seemed certain, replaced by a mystery.

I find deep comfort in the idea that God has told us all we need to know about him, and yet his eternal nature is always beyond us. We proclaim 'Christ is risen!' but that short phrase contains a universe of meaning. We are perpetually being called beyond where we are now – including the divisions and organisations we establish between our Church communities – into an unknown country. He is alive; and he is not here.
